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LIMB SALVAGE SURGERY

Limb-sparing surgery is now a safe and effective method of treatment for most individuals. The goal of limb-sparing surgery is safe and complete removal of the tumour with preservation of limb function. The use of a metal endoprosthesis & microsurgical techniques to reconstruct bone and joint after the removal of a tumour is the main principle. The goal is to get back to the activities or quality of life as soon as possible.

These bone cancers occur most commonly in children.


OSTEOSARCOMA & EWING'S SARCOMA has a wider age range, typically between 5 – 18 years old, although it can also arise in very young children or older adults. The exact no of people who develop bone cancer each year in India is not known but it appears to be quite significant. Current treatment depends on the intensive use of chemotherapy, reconstructive surgery and in some cases radiation therapy. Treatment can extend over many months and, many patients now survive, Some important facts one must know are

Bone cancer symptoms include disturbing, non traumatic night pain and swelling around the affected area and problems with movement


It is often diagnosed by medical professionals as growing pains or a sports injury

It can be best identified by unsettling pain & an early plain MRI

The survival rates have improved drastically due to the developments in modern Imaging modalities, chemotherapy, surgical skills, international co-operations and radiation therapy.
